


The design maquettes gave students a chance to research and identify historically accurate signs of the time to be included in their story. These incorporated colors, clothing, locations, figures and more. The storyboards are composed of twenty to thirty vignettes that portray the actions in their story outline. The design maguettes and the storyboards were created using source images to trace, scan and digitally color in Adobe Photoshop or Adobe Illustrator. Both of these products were used as references to assist students during the writing process by providing them with a descriptive resource for a time and a place that they haven't experienced. Ayako and Korkora arrive at an isolated temple. They are accepted into the monastery and are immersed in the Buddhist religion.




They learn to meditate from Buddhist monks, who show them a path to

When they arrive at the temple, they are greeted by a larger than life statue of the Amida Buddha, a symbol of longevity and awareness. The Amitabha is often referred to as "The Buddha of Infinite Light".



They see a man wearing a simple yellow and brown robe sitting in solitude with a look of pure happiness. Ayako feels connected spiritually to this man, Fo Hsing, which translates to "Enlightened One".



Korkora walks into town and is welcomed by crowds of city people. Amongst the hustle of wandering Japanese, she sees a young soldier sitting outside of a busy little coffee shop.



The soldier, Isamu, seems very interested in Korkora, but being someone with a recognized reputation, he can't afford to be seen with her in ragged old clothes, He refers her to a geisha house where she can earn money and become presentable.

Korkora continues to see Isamu, and their relationship blossoms. He teaches her how to love and care for another person, emotions she hadn't felt before. However, she still has a feeling of empti-



Because Korkora doesn't recognize the materialistic person she has become, she desires to take her own life by jumping into a well. However, she doesn't jump because she realizes she is pregrant, which makes her feel happy and blessed.




Korkora runs into her mother one last time and shares with her the news of her father and her enlightenment.





Mary and her mother live alone on Jeremiah Kandy's farm, They are the only ones from their family on that farm, The father and brother were sold to another plantation.




Frame 4: Jererniah Kandy is the wealthy owner of the plantation, Kandy has one son.

Frame 8: Jeremiah Kandy needs to choose two new house slaves. He comes out of the house and chooses Mary and Bethany.




Frame 9: Mary and Bethany become house slaves working under the supervision of Jeremiah Kandy, They are the newest house slaves and learn the rules of the house.

Mary notices this man is her brother, which eases her depression.




Frame 13: Jeremiah Kandy Jr. and Mary fall in love.



Frame 14: Jeremiah Jr. and Mary have a family.





Frame 17: Mary forgets her family and pays more attention to her secret




Frame 18:







Santiago takes a stroll and sees a merchant. Santiago wants to help him sel raccoon skins. The merchant, excited for the help, says yes.




Santiago learns to hunt with a bow. He becomes a master, rarely missing his target.

While wandering through the forest, Santiago meets a man named Alo. Alo invites him to stay in his hut, and with nowhere else to go, Santiago accepts his offer,




After some thought and discussions with Alo, Santiago realizes that it was the river that made him realize he was unhappy. In order to follow the river, he builds a raft he can live on.



When the raft is complete, he builds a small tent and brings it aboard. He says goodbye to Alo before he pushes away from the riverbank.







Noah takes Faye back to a hotel, and they have drinks and make love.




The next morning he wakes up and leaves without saying anything. He runs towards the Seine River and begins to sell jewelry along the river.





Alberto and Clayton leave to join the bounty hunters. They leave behind their badges of authority, only bringing bare ne-




The bounty hunters obliterate Ugly Dave of the Pearsall Mine

the gang to make sure their bounty is complete.




Alberto and Clayton capture Dirty Paco, the bandito, and kill his escort. His horse gets away though -- you can't kill the animals, just the women.
