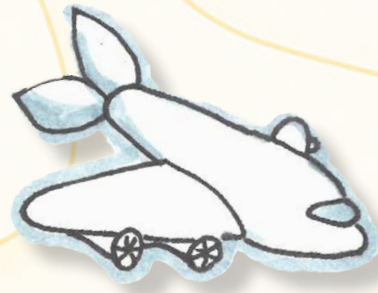

Introduction

Did you know that there are more than 130 Santa Fes around the world? There are nine in the United States, including our hometown Santa Fe, New Mexico. The most Santa Fe locations on any continent is in South America. We would like to acknowledge the 19 Pueblos who have stewarded the land in New Mexico where our Santa Fe is found. We would also like to recognize the indegnous peoples on all the continents that we have learned about who have also stewarded the land since time immemorial.

Why Santa Fe you may ask? During this expedition we began learning about geography through the lens of the five Themes of Geography. The themes include location, place, movement, human environment interactions, and regions. We learned that Santa Fe, New Mexico isn't located in a high desert - it's a semi-arid steppe! To further explore the five themes of geography, students chose different Santa Fe locations around the world to research, and created the Atlas you are about to explore!

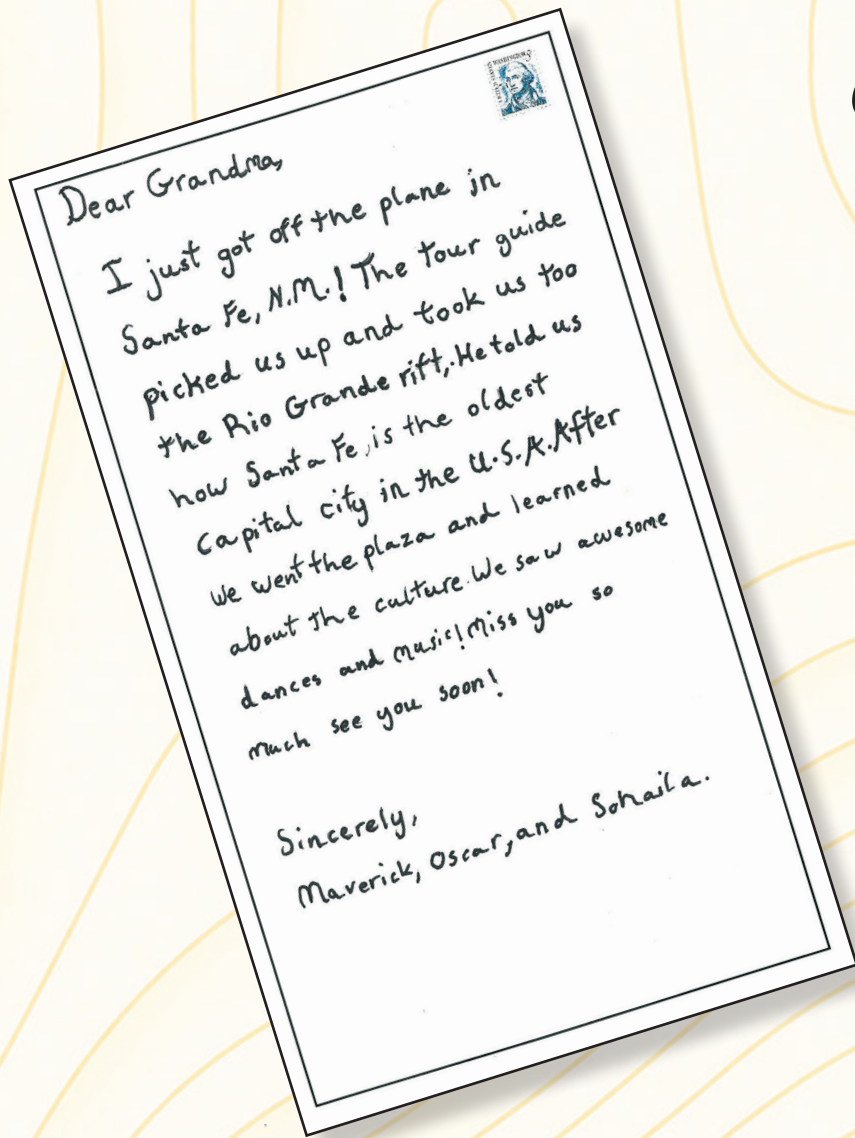

Santa Fe is 7,000 ft above sea level.



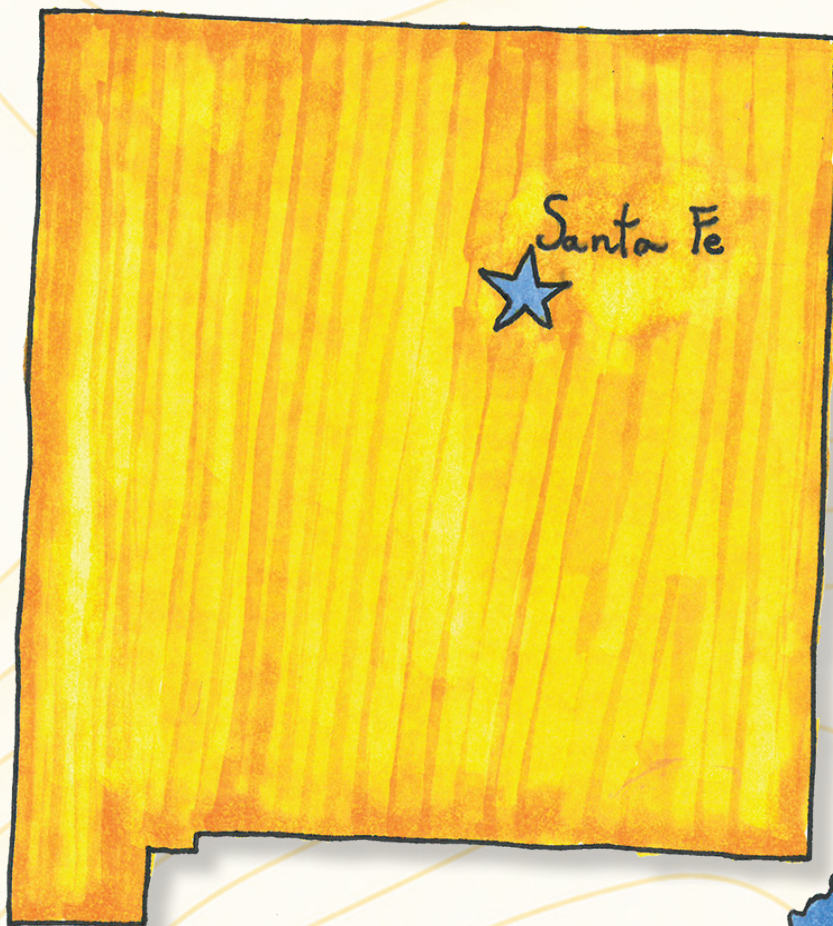

Desert?

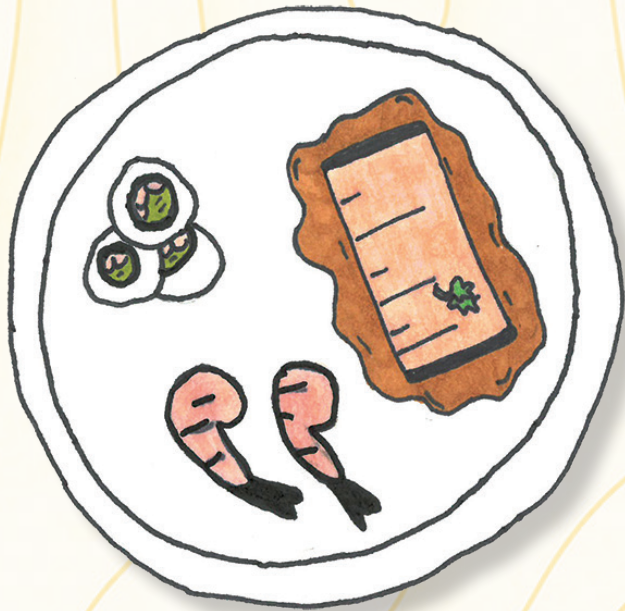
Most people think Santa Fe is a desert but it's not. It is actually a Semi Arid Steppe because it receives between 10-20 inches of precipitation yearly.

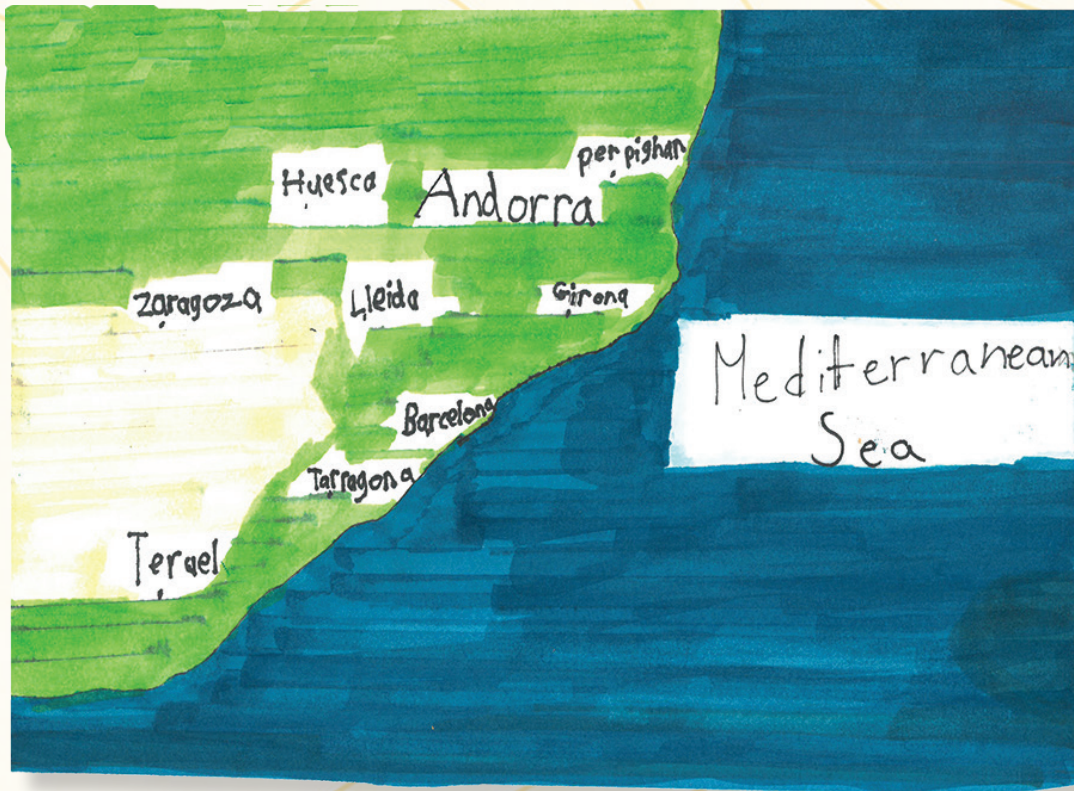
The population of Barcelona is 5,658,00

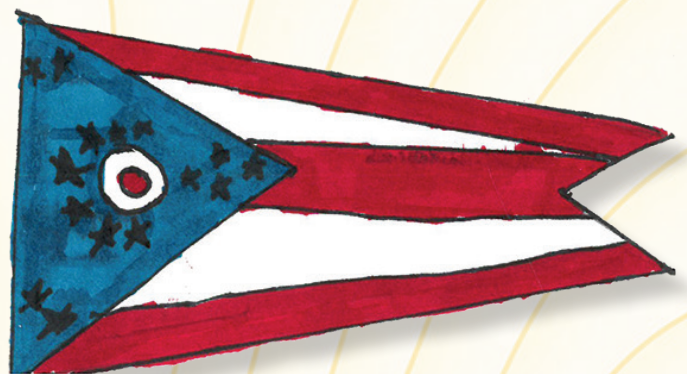


Buckeye State

The ribbon snake isn't poisonous so don't be alarmed!

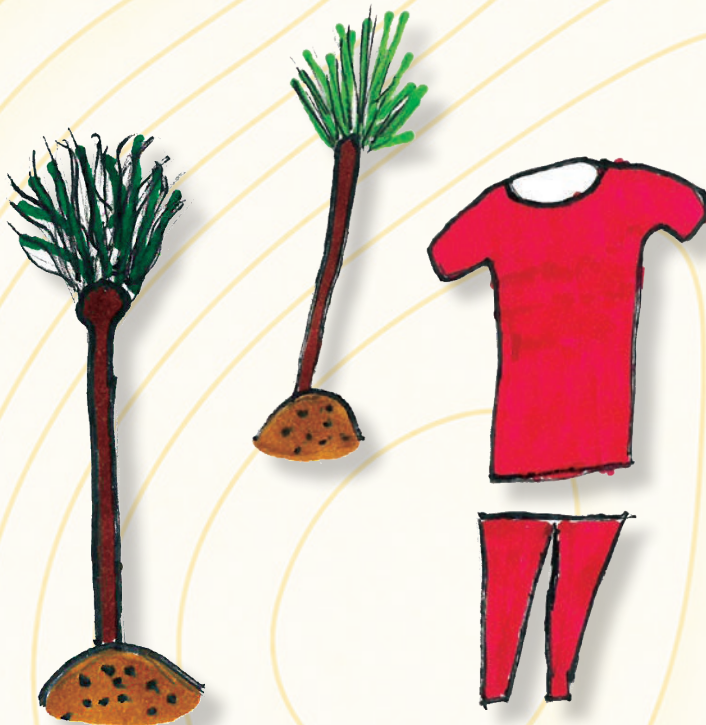


Santa Fe,

There is replica of the Titanic in Tennessee, in Pigeon Forge! It is the World's largest museum attraction.

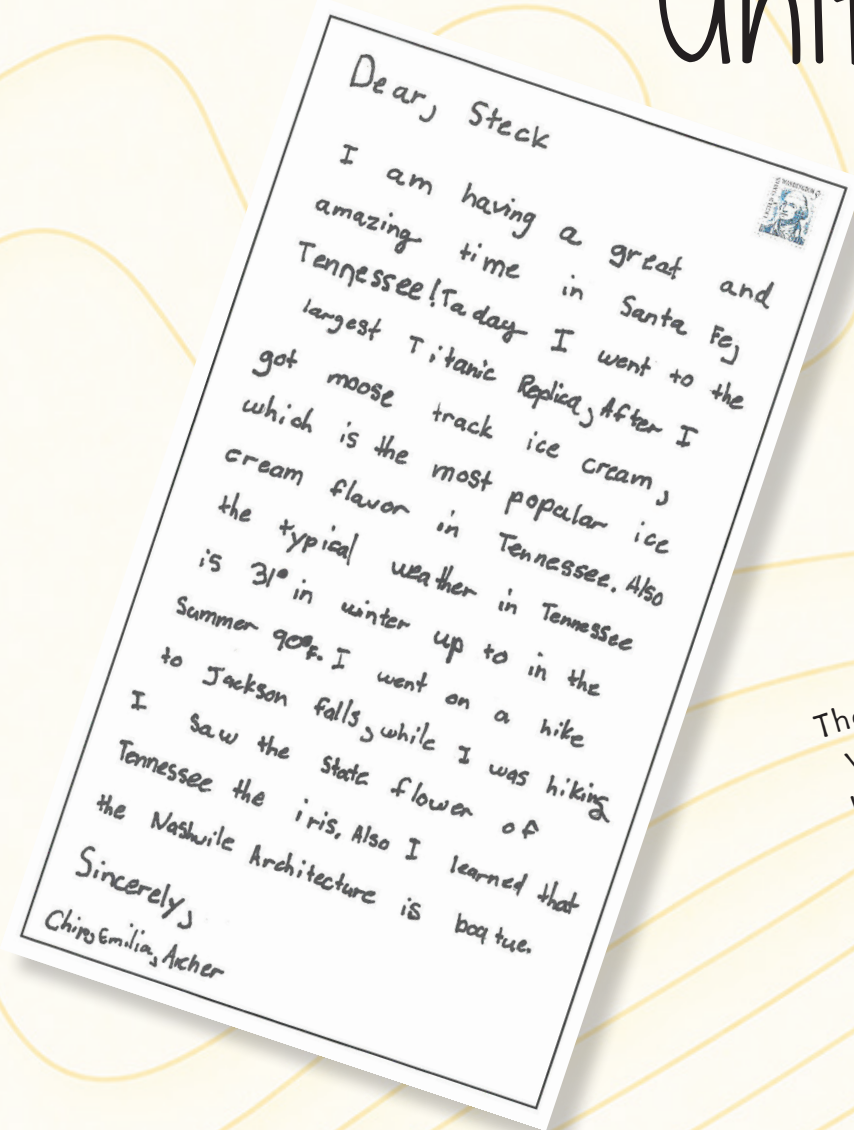

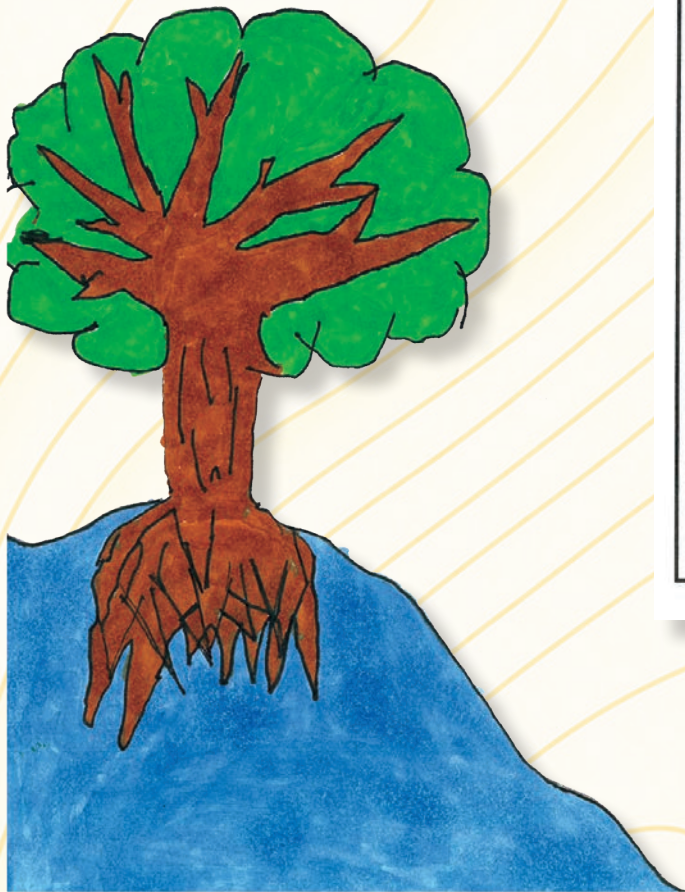

Florida is home to St. Augustine, the country's oldest permanent European settlement, established by the Spanish in 1565.

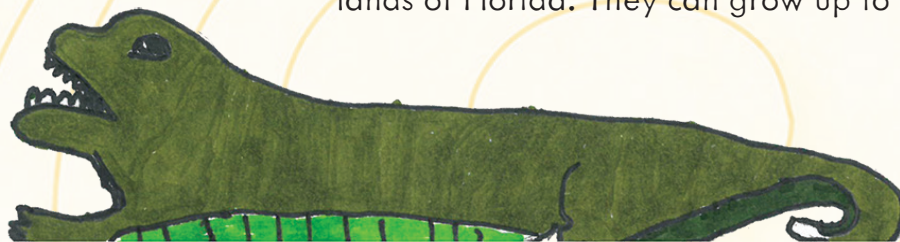

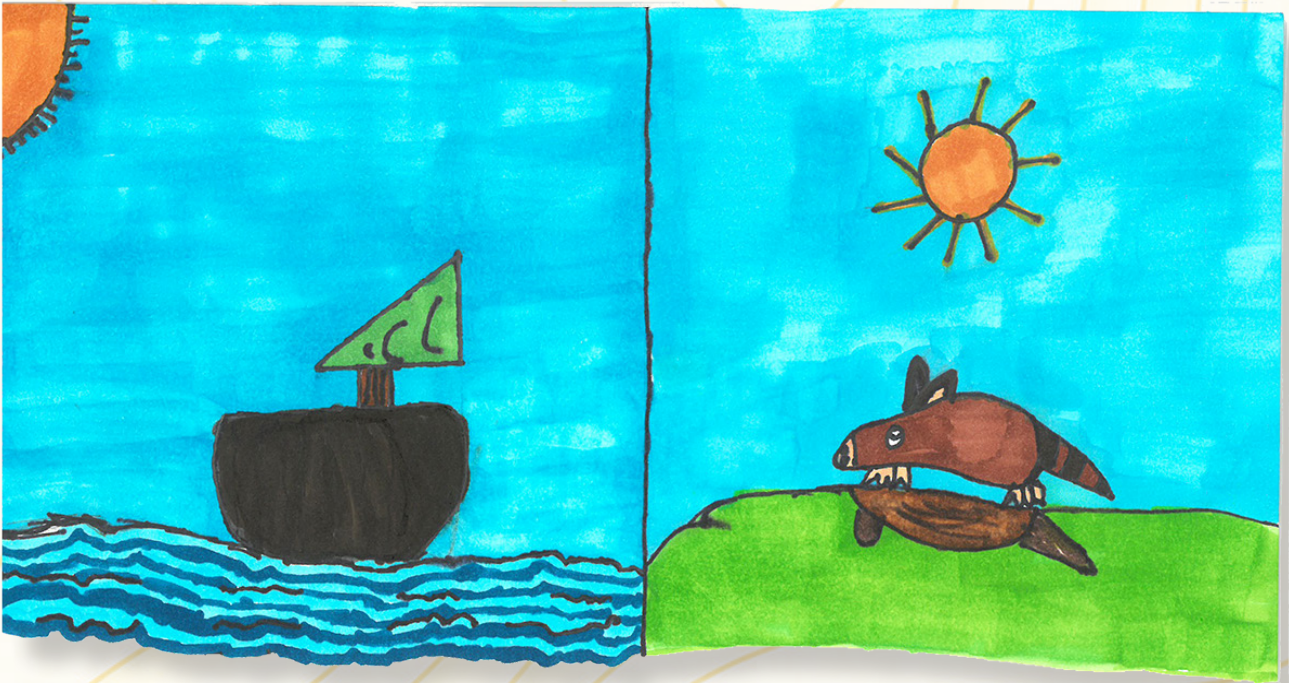
Andalusia is the only known habitat of the Iberian wolf, which nearly went extinct during the 1900s when the Spanish dictator Francisco ordered an extermination of them.

Isla Santa Fe has the most endemic species in the world, such as the Santa Fe land iguana, the Santa Fe rice rat, and the Santa Fe fur seal.

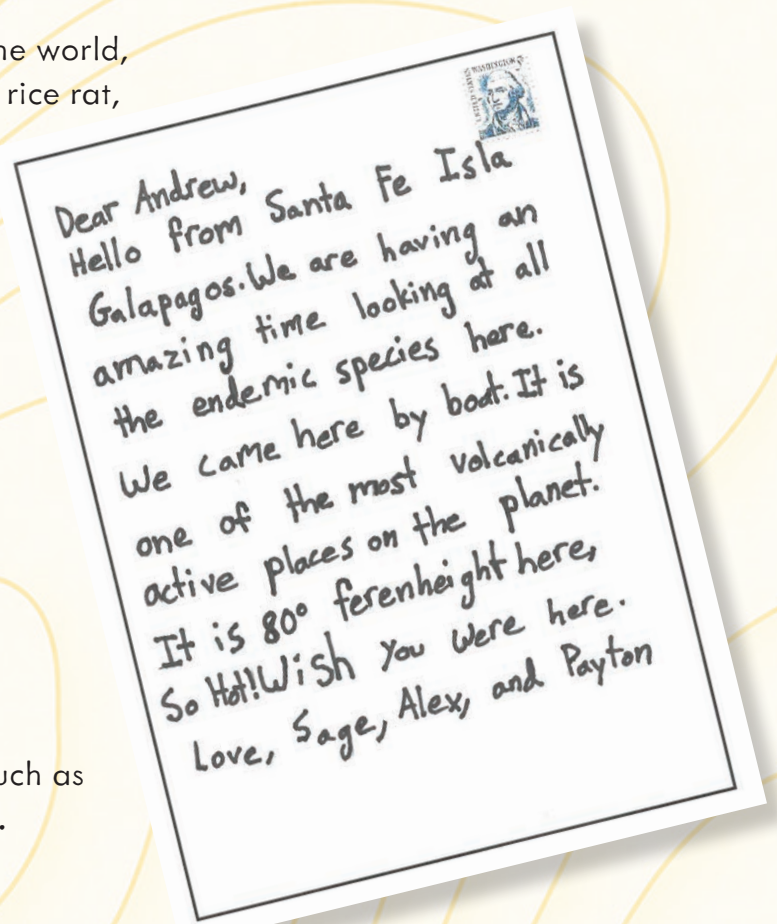

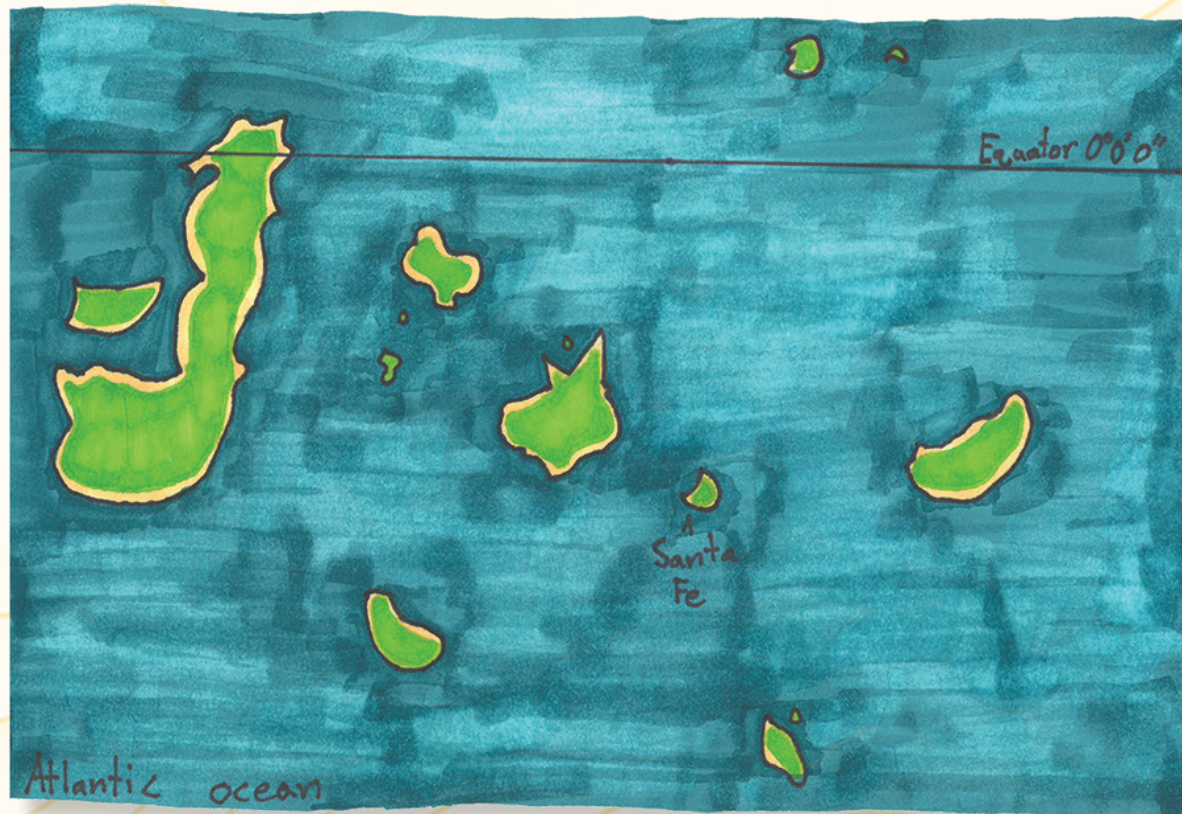
Isla Santa Fe is home to many types of birds such as the Blue, Red, and White footed Boobies.

History

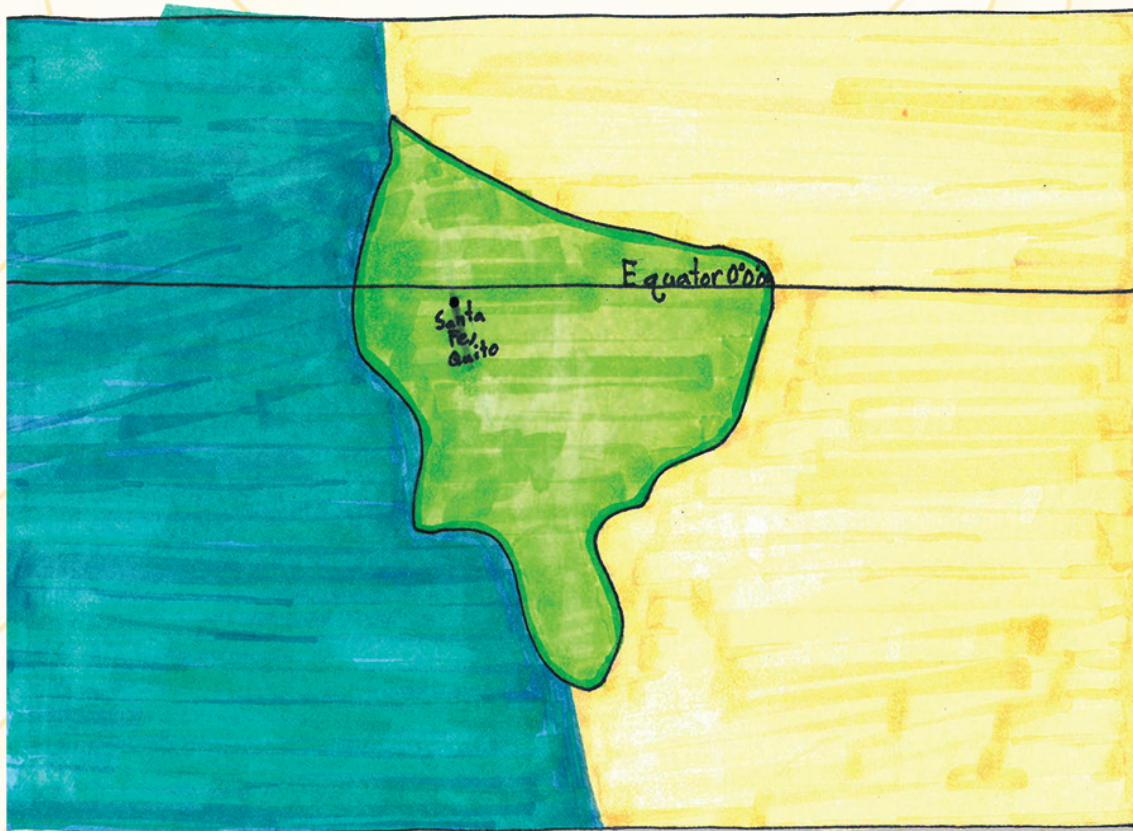
The name Isla Santa Fe originated in Spain, and was given to the island by Spanish Conquistadors.

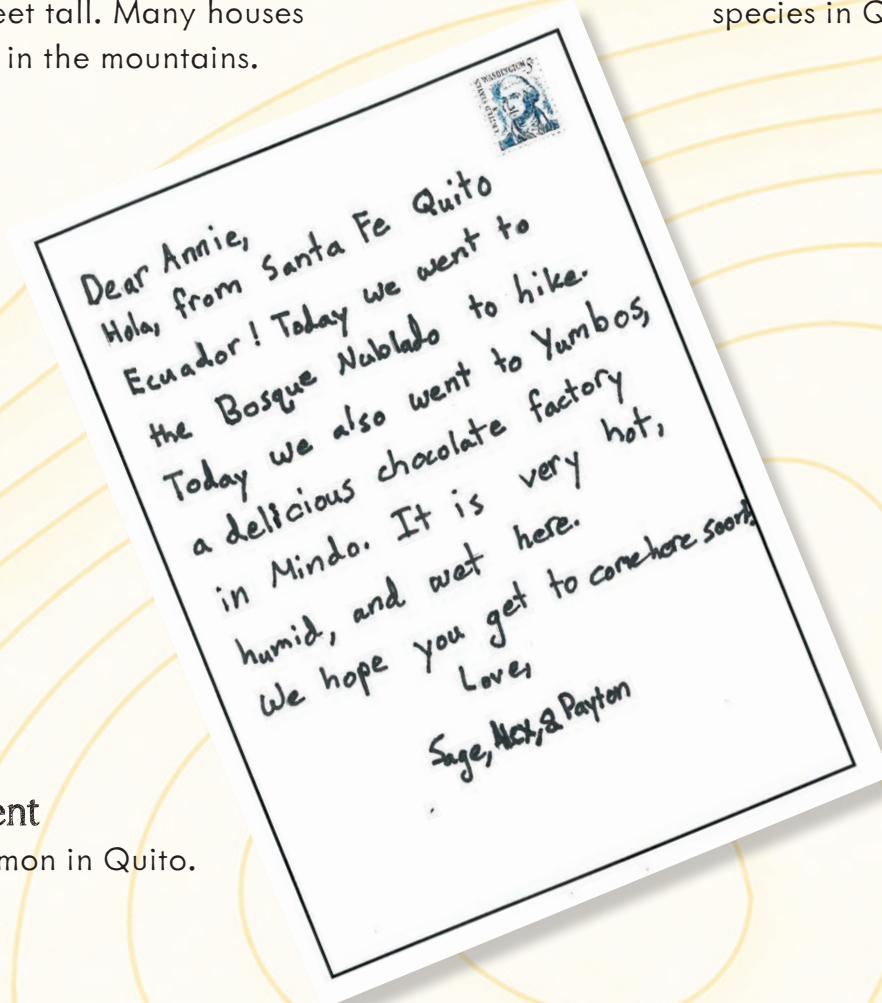


Thin Air

The hutia is a common animal in Cuba. It is a moderately large cave rodent!

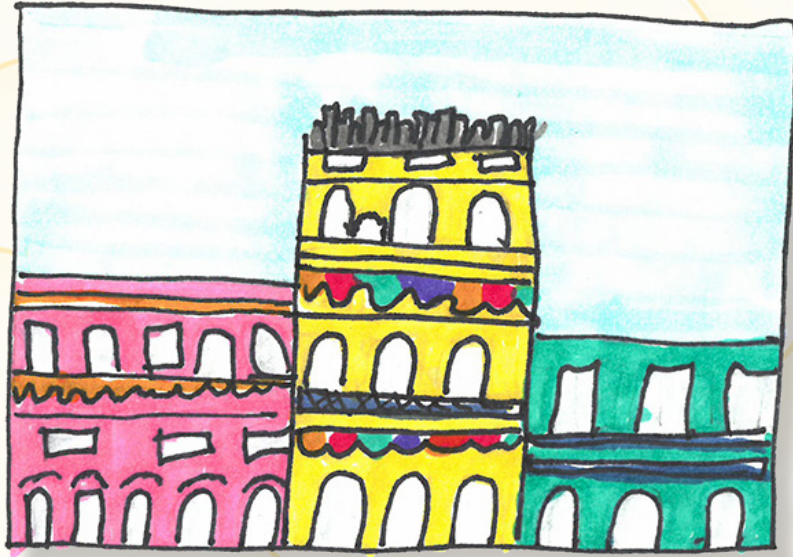
Dear Andrew,

The bus finally stopped at a restaurant and we eat delicious Ropa Vieja and plantains. I can't wait to see you.

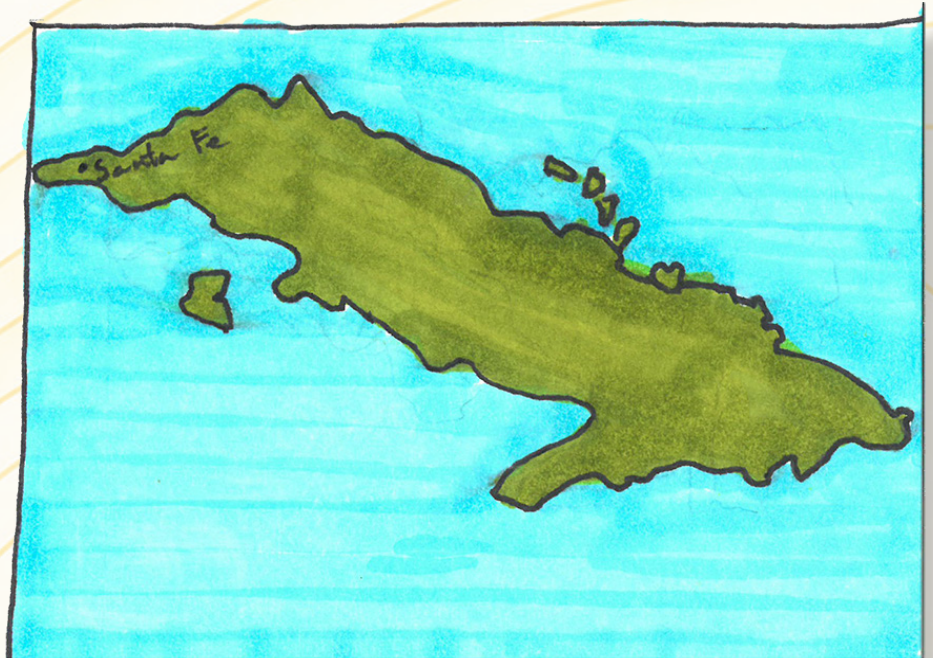

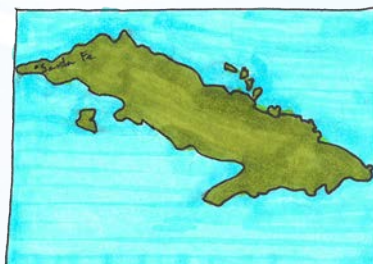
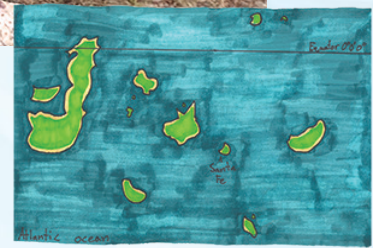
Art
